At The Hills Academy we strive to create a culture of children who love to read not only to support their learning but for pleasure too.

We believe that reading is an important skill that allows our children to thrive to be the best that they can be in all areas of their learning and lives. Reading is planned into the English curriculum through phonics in EYFS-Year 1 &2, guided reading sessions, 'stop, drop and read' time and class stories.
